Uniform and Equipment Policy - Les Beaucamps High School**

High standards of dress and personal appearance for all students are an important part of Les Beaucamps High School. We expect students to take pride in their appearance and in being a member of the school community. All items, unless indicated, are available from a number of uniform suppliers including **Fletcher Sports, Game Changers** and **Shoestring**.

Uniform Allowance – The States of Guernsey operates a means-tested grant scheme to help parents with the cost of buying school uniforms. Years 7 to 11 - Uniform	
Blazer	Navy embroidered blazer with logo on left chest pocket. Blazer to be worn at all times.
Pullover (optional)	V-neck navy pullover with school logo. Only to be worn under school blazer.
Tie	Years 7 – 10: Royal blue clip-on tie should be worn at all times* Year 11: Royal blue/silver striped clip on tie (<i>different coloured ties provided for Prefects</i>)* * From 2027, clip-on ties will be a requirement therefore it is advised that these are purchased now to avoid incurring extra costs in the future.
Skirts, Trousers, Shorts & Belts	Skirt: Navy, pleated and designed to sit no more than just above the knee. If you have any concerns about skirt length, please contact the Pastoral Team. To protect privacy, black trunk style fitted shorts (i.e.: yoga shorts) may be worn under skirts, however these must not be visible below the hemline. Trousers: Tailored, navy, standard length trousers that sit no more than just above (or on) shoes. No denim, no chinos and no skinny jeans. Shorts: Navy tailored shorts. These must be suitable school wear only and purchased from uniform retailers. Shorts must sit on (or just above) the knee. Belt: If a belt is required then it must be plain black.
Shirts	White, plain, long or short sleeved shirt. No polo shirts.
Shoes	Must be smart, plain black, school style shoes (this does not include black trainers, boots, backless, stiletto, canvas, ballet pumps, sling-back or toeless shoes). A guide to shoes is attached to this document.

Socks & Tights	<p>Socks: must be plain white if worn with a skirt or plain black/navy with trousers and shorts. No trainer socks or sports logos.</p> <p>Tights: must be navy/black Socks are not to be worn over tights.</p>
Coats	A sensible school coat which can be worn over the school blazer to and from school and outside during break/lunchtimes. Hoodies, jumpers and coats are not to be worn within the building.
Jewellery	<p>Students may wear one pair of plain stud earrings & a wrist watch.</p> <p>No other jewellery may be worn; this includes secondary/other piercings, wrist bands, wrist straps, thread bracelets etc.</p> <p>All facial piercings must be removed before school; covering with a plaster is not acceptable.</p>
Make-Up, Nails & Hair	<p>Make-up: discrete, light make-up may be worn. Heavy eye-shadow and lipstick are not acceptable. If a student is wearing too much make-up they will be spoken to and asked to remove it with make-up remover wipes (kept on site).</p> <p>False eyelashes or coloured (cosmetic) contact lenses are not permitted.</p> <p>Nails: All coloured varnish (including pale), nail extensions, gel nails are not acceptable and should not be worn. Clear varnish is permitted.</p> <p>Hair: hair colour and hairstyles should not be extreme. Hair should be worn off the face and in a smart, sensible style. If you have any doubt about a hairstyle/couleur please check with the school before any change takes place. Grade 2 minimum.</p> <p>No extreme styles. Tramlines and other razored patterns are not acceptable.</p>
<p>If the above dress code is not followed then the student will be asked to remove the offending item and it may be confiscated until the end of the school day. If a student is missing an item then the item will be lent to them.</p>	

Physical Education Kit

Students must have a note of explanation from home if for any reason they are not wearing the required kit.

T Shirt	Royal blue PE tee with school logo.
Hooded Top	Optional grey hooded sweatshirt embroidered with school logo. No other hoodie to be substituted.
Shorts & Skort	Plain black PE shorts; Plain black skort; Plain black leggings (<i>optional</i>); Plain black tracksuit bottoms (<i>optional</i>).
Socks	Plain white long or short socks.
Shoes	Sports trainers.

Swimming	Swim shorts, trunks or one piece swimming costume. Towel. Goggles and swim cap (<i>optional</i>).
Hockey, Football & Rugby	Suitable boots for the activity (<i>suitable for AstroTurf and field</i>); Football socks should be navy knee length (<i>to cover shin pads</i>); Shin pads (<i>highly recommended</i>); Gum shield (<i>highly recommended</i>).

Equipment Policy

In order for students to maximise their learning, it is *vital* that they have the correct equipment with them. We expect all students to bring the following to school each day:

Chromebook	Students must bring their Chromebook (fully charged) to school everyday. Chromebooks should not be used during break or lunch unless given direct permission by a member of staff.
Stationery	Students must carry three pens (<i>2x black/blue and 1x green</i>), two pencils, a ruler and rubber in their pencil case at all times. A whiteboard will be supplied by the school. A pencil sharpener, a set of colouring pencils, highlighters, green biro pens, a 4B pencil and a fine-liner (<i>Art</i>) are not essential but are highly recommended.
Pencil Case	Students must keep all stationery within a pencil case. Students move to several different classrooms throughout the day and this ensures their equipment does not get lost and is easily accessible.
School Bag	Books and equipment should be carried in a substantial bag which should fit inside a locker. Handbags and clutch bags are not acceptable.
Reading Book	All students in years 7 to 9 must have their Accelerated Reader (<i>'AR'</i>) library book with them at all times.
Scientific Calculator	For both Maths and Science, students will be required to use a scientific calculator. The following model is highly recommended: Casio FX-85GTPLUS Scientific Calculator (£8-£10 on www.amazon.co.uk). Calculators can also be purchased from our Maths and Science departments.
Headphones	Students should bring a set of headphones in order to access multimedia content in lessons. The most basic headphones are more than adequate, but they must have a 3.5mm connector, rather than newer models that come with smartphones with a USB-C or 'lightning' connector. Headphones are sold in the school stationery shop in the Library.
